### **Last night Marlon Hargis was charged with as follows:**

- 3 Counts Tampering with evidence**
- 1 Count Resisting Arrest**
- 1 Count Possession Controlled Dangerous Substances**
- 1 Count Possession CDS within a school zone**
- 1 Count Unlawful Possession of a firearm**
- 1 Count Possession of a firearm for unlawful purpose**
- 1 Count receiving stolen property**

**He remains in the Atlantic County Justice Facility on \$100,000 full cash bail.**

MAYS LANDING – First Assistant Prosecutor Murray Talasnik announced the arrest Thursday of an Atlantic County resident in connection with a traffic stop that led to a foot chase and the recovery of 245 bags of heroin and a handgun.

At 10:54 a.m. Pleasantville police conducting traffic enforcement stopped Marlon Hargis Jr., 27, at the corner of Lake Place and Main Street in Pleasantville. While conducting the motor vehicle stop, Hargis ran from the officers and discarded items, which was later field-tested positive for heroin. Officers from throughout Atlantic County conducted an area search for the suspect who was located shortly thereafter, Talasnik stated.

A gunshot was fired in the area of 25 Charles Place where police located Hargis and also recovered a stolen handgun. Charges are pending further investigation.

**\*\*\*These charges are merely an accusation and not proof of guilt. In all criminal cases, a charged defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.**
