MAYS LANDING – Authorities are seeking information in connection with the death of an Absecon man discovered in tidal marshes along Leeds Avenue in Pleasantville last night, Atlantic County Prosecutor Ted Housel stated Saturday evening.

Pleasantville police acting on information, responded to the 200 block of Leeds Avenue at 7:45 p.m. on Dec. 25, where they discovered a body of a man, later identified as Kenneth Mack, 42, of 1 Oyster Bay, dead in the marsh, Prosecutor Housel stated.

Mack, who was mentally challenged, was last seen in the area of Linden Avenue and Leeds Avenue on Dec. 14. A family member contacted police and reported him missing that same day, Prosecutor Housel said.

Notification of next of kin has been made and an autopsy was performed. No further information will be released at this time, Prosecutor Housel stated.
