MAYS LANDING— An Atlantic County Grand Jury indicted an Atlantic City man Wednesday afternoon for multiple offenses including aggravated sexual assault, endangering the welfare of a child and child abuse, as a result of numerous assaults on an 11-year-old girl. The defendant was also indicted for the alleged aggravated assault on a police officer, resisting arrest and two weapons offenses, Atlantic County Prosecutor Ted Housel stated.

It is alleged that on diverse dates between July 1, 2008 and Aug. 17, 2009, Camilo Moro-Rojas, 32, committed numerous sexual assaults on the child of his former girlfriend. It is further alleged that the assaults took place when the defendant would visit the victim at her N. Windsor Avenue home in Atlantic City. When the child told her mother on Aug. 18, 2009, the mother immediately contacted police. The defendant was arrested approximately a half an hour later at 18 North Hartford Avenue in Atlantic City. During the arrest Moro-Rojas violently resisted, produced a knife and stabbed Officer James Miltenberger in the arm. The injury required surgery and caused nerve damage to the officer's arm. He was out of work on medical leave for four months, according to Assistant Prosecutor Bill Merz, who presented the case to the Grand Jury.

Aggravated sexual assault, the most serious count in the indictment, carries a prison term of up to 20 years. Third-degree aggravated assault carries a term of up to five years and third-degree resisting arrest carries a term of five years in prison and five years for aggravated assault on a police officer. Upon conviction, a defendant would also face thousands of dollars in fines.

*****The indictment is merely an accusation. The defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.**
