MAYS LANDING— An Atlantic County Grand Jury indicted a Galloway Township woman today on two counts of aggravated assault and one count of criminal mischief for a Feb. 20 incident in which the woman had an altercation with two people at a “Super” Wawa in Egg Harbor Township and ran one of them over with an automobile, Atlantic County Prosecutor Ted Housel announced.

On Feb. 20, 2010, Brittany Campbell, 22, went to the “Super” Wawa, located on the Black Horse Pike in the Cardiff Section of Egg Harbor Township. Her ex-boyfriend and his girlfriend were in his girlfriend’s car, at the gas pumps. Campbell allegedly pulled her vehicle in front of the woman’s vehicle and struck the front of the car. Campbell then got out of the car and threw an object at the woman’s vehicle. When the victim got out to see the damage to her vehicle, Campbell reversed her car. The victim walked in front of her car to look at the damage and that is when Campbell struck her and pushed the victim’s vehicle nine feet propelling the victim onto the hood of Campbell’s vehicle, according to Assistant Prosecutor Harlee Stein, who presented the case to the Grand Jury.

Campbell fled the scene on Tilton Road. A warrant was issued for her arrest. Campbell turned herself in to police three days after the incident, posted bail and remains free pending the outcome of the case, Stein said.

Egg Harbor Township paramedics treated the victim at the scene. AtlantiCare paramedics transported her to AtlantiCare Regional Medical Center, City Campus, where she was treated for multiple injuries. She was released three days later. Campbell’s ex-boyfriend was unharmed, Stein said.

The Grand Jury indicted Campbell on criminal mischief for causing more than \$2,000 in property damage to the victim’s vehicle.

Third-degree aggravated assault, the most serious count in the indictment, carries a maximum prison term of up to five years in prison and up to a \$15,000 fine.

**\*\*\*The indictment is merely an accusation. The defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.**
