MAYS LANDING— In response to media inquiries Atlantic County Prosecutor Ted Housel stated today that his office continues to actively investigate the murders of Barbara Breidor, Molly Jean Dilts, Kim Raffo and Tracy Ann Roberts. Their bodies were recovered from a drainage ditch in the West Atlantic City section of Egg Harbor Township nearly four years ago.

The victims' identities were determined through intensive investigative efforts during the week following the Nov. 20, 2006 discovery.

Prosecutor Housel stated that the case remains an active and open investigation and members of his office are following leads as they come in. Other law enforcement agencies assisting in the investigation include the United States Justice Department, the FBI, federal and state forensic laboratories, the New Jersey State Police along with the Egg Harbor Township and Atlantic City Police Departments.

In 2009 Prosecutor Housel assigned additional personnel to the investigation along with continually utilizing national databanks such as ViCAP, the Justice Department's Violent Criminal Apprehension Program, and the FBI's Critical Incident Response Group.
