MAYS LANDING— A Middlesex County man was arrested yesterday morning and charged with second-degree sexual assault, third-degree endangering the welfare of a child and fourth-degree criminal sexual contact, for allegedly having sex with a 13-year-old at an Atlantic City casino, Atlantic County Prosecutor Ted Housel announced.

It is alleged that Jacky Wang, 24, of East Brunswick, went to the Trump Taj Mahal Casio Resort on July 20, 2010, where he met with the teenager and had sex with her. Through an investigation by Prosecutor's Office detectives revealed that the teen ran away from her residence in Woodbridge, Middlesex County, and made her way to Atlantic City. She went to the casino, met Wang and had the sexual encounter.

ACPO Detectives Bill Adamson and Luke Ireland conducted the investigation along with members of the Department of Human Services and the FBI.

Superior Court Judge Bernard E. DeLury set Wang's bail at \$100,000 cash or bond.

Second-degree sexual assault carries a prison term of up to 10 years and \$150,000 in fines. Endangering the welfare of a child, a third-degree crime, carries a prison term of up to five years and a \$15,000 fine and fourth-degree criminal sexual contact carries a prison term of up to 18 months and \$10,000 in fines.

*****These charges are merely an accusation and not proof of guilt. In all criminal cases, a charged defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.**
